Cambronne-les-Clermont, Saint-Etienne

The northern arm of the now-demolished church is the earliest remaining, and the wall for north nave aisle, or part of it. Then the south arm, followed by a longish pause of over 25 years.

The crossing was rebuilt in the 30s with complex junctions where the new shafts against the old. The nave was added in the 50s and the tower with spire shortly afterwards.

Starting in the 1230s the older east end was replaced by a 4-bay choir, with the part closest to the older church the more advanced.
